**MOBLEY**—As mentioned in Saturday's paper, Elizabeth Larue Mobley passed away due to complications with cancer July 21, 2015.

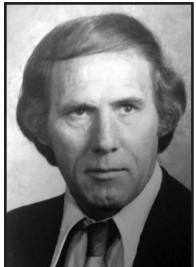

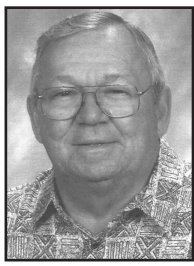
She was a wonderful mother and will be missed.

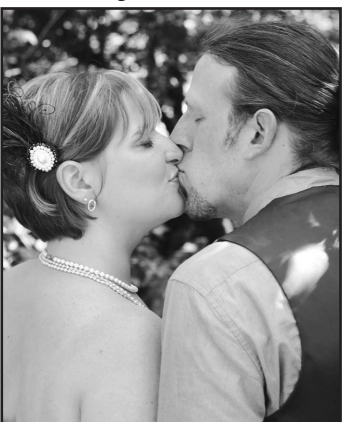
Maid/matron of honor was Zoe Rolly and the best man was Adam Bacon.
