## Disaster prep main focus of 'Our Town'

Disaster preparation, the Relay for Life, Habitat for Humanity and Siuslaw Outreach Services will be in the spotlight during this week's episode of Our Town on Coast Radio KCST FM.

The locally produced community service program will feature extended conversations with a variety of people on those four topics.

Most of the time will be spent talking about disaster preparedness.

WLEOG chairwoman Megan Messmer, Florence Police Chief Tom Turner, Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue Chief Jim Langborg, and Lane County Emergency Manager Linda Cook will be in the studio Wednesday from 4 to 6 p.m. to talk about their work so far.

Joining the conversation by phone will be Althea Rizzo, the Geologic Hazards Coordinator Oregon Emergency for Management.

Three other topics will be discussed on today's edition of Our Town.

The American Cancer Society Relay for Life has been raising awareness and money for cancer research and advocacy in Florence since 2000. The 16th annual Florence Relay is set for this weekend, Aug. 8, and co-chair Nicole Hundley says there will be a few changes.

David Wiegan will talk about a recently completed remodel at SOS. Wiegan is the executive director for the multi-cause agency that provides services to victims of domestic and sexual abuse, low income families and the homeless in our area.

A new roof and internal remodeling of its 60-year-old building will allow them to focus more on their mission and less on mopping the floors after a rain storm.

The final topic on Our Town will be a conversation with Kate McBroom Redwine and Ken Gaylord with Habitat for Humanity. The organization recently broke ground on its 27th home; but they are also spending a great deal of time working on revitalizing neighborhoods and helping people make home repairs that they
