Disaster prep main focus of ‘Our Town’

Disaster preparation, the Relay for Life, Habitat for Humanity and Siuslaw Outreach Services will be in the spotlight during this week's episode of Our Town on Coast Radio KCST FM. The locally produced community service program will feature extended conversations with a variety of people on those four topics. Most of the time will be spent talking about disaster preparedness. A single story in the New Yorker magazine last month

did more than hundreds of town hall meetings and disaster preparedness workshops to raise the awareness of the likelihood of a devastating earthquake and coast-wrecking tsunami along the Oregon coast. That story has been shared on social media, has prompted countless discussions and perhaps most importantly, caused a lot of people to take seriously the need to have an emergency cache of supplies at home. Online retailers of disaster kits are saying their most popular items are on back order and they've done more business in recent weeks than they remember.

Key members of a local coalition that formed 10 years ago following a similar disaster in Indonesia are also trying to capitalize on the attention created by the New Yorker magazine story about the Cascadia Subduction Zone. Several members of the West Lane Emergency Operations Group (WLEOG) will be in the studio with Our Town host Bob Sneddon. WLEOG consists of eight agencies, and about a dozen more affiliated groups. They meet regularly to talk about planning for a large scale disaster; and how to work on recovery. They don't focus strictly on earthquakes and tsunamis. Their scope of work also

includes things like major storms, chemical spills, wild-fire, and just about anything else that would require a widespread emergency response. WLEOG chairwoman Megan Messmer, Florence Police Chief Tom Turner, Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue Chief Jim Langborg, and Lane County Emergency Manager Linda Cook will be in the studio Wednesday from 4 to 6 p.m. to talk about their work so far. Joining the conversation by phone will be Althea Rizzo, the Geologic Hazards Coordinator for Oregon Emergency Management. Three other topics will be discussed on today's edition of Our Town. The American Cancer Society Relay for Life has been raising awareness and money for cancer research and advocacy in Florence since 2000. The 16th annual Florence Relay is set for this weekend, Aug. 8, and co-chair Nicole Hundley says there will be a few changes. The biggest is that instead of running 24 hours on the walking path at Miller Park, it will only be 12 hours long. Opening ceremonies are set for noon Saturday. Hundley will talk about the schedule, as well as how much money they hope to raise. Siuslaw Outreach Services'
