The event, staged The drill is scheduled by PeaceHealth, will focus on response plans for an actual disaster that would trigger a sudden influx of patients, media, and concerned community members in addition to the day to day patient activity at the hospital.

> It will also provide onscene training for local emergency responders.

Organizers caution that the event is a significant exercise and the local community can expect to see emergency responders at PeaceHealth Harbor Peace Medical Center and Siuslaw High School looking and acting as if it were a true disaster.

Emergency staff and drill participants with mock injuries may be seen by motorists and pedestrians in the area.

Citizens may also hear drill communication over the police, fire, EMS and other emergency response radio frequencies.

Florence media outlets are asked to alert the public not to be alarmed if they see drill equipment and participants around the main hospital entrance and the high school or hear information over the radio frequencies between 7 a.m. and noon on Aug. 19.
