Happy 100th birthday Arline Chellis!

Spruce Point poetry appreciation group leader turns 100 today

In 1915, when Arline Chellis was born, the life expectancy for men was 52.5 years and 56.8 years for women. So when people asked her, when she was a child, what she wanted out of life, her reply must have seemed childishly ludicrous.

"I informed them that when I grew up I was going to live to be at least 100," Chellis said.

And today, she fulfilled that childhood goal.

Family and friends gathered at Spruce Point assisted living facility to throw her a surprise party on Wednesday, three days before her actual birthday, today, Sept. 19.

"My daughter came to take me down to the activity room, when I came around the corner and saw everybody lined up I thought, 'What in

the world is going on?' The party was a wonderful surprise," she said.

"This is the first surprise birthday party she has ever

had," said daughter Darline Arndt.

In retrospect, Chellis observed, "When I think about 100 years, I think that

is an awful long time. But it doesn't seem like that at all.

"I tell people, sometimes, I wonder why I even get up out of bed, because by the time I turn around a couple of times, it's time to go back to bed. The day goes so fast," she added.

Chellis is still perusing her lifelong passion of writing poetry and leads a weekly poetry appreciation group at Spruce Point. All poetry lovers are invited to attend.

Mayor Joe Henry dropped by to read an official proclamation in honor of the event.

Police still seek to ID body found in woods

The Florence Police Department (FPD) is still working to identify the body of a man found in the wooded area north of Sandpines Golf Links on Aug. 30.

Police worked with the Lane County Medical Examiner, who conducted an examination of the body.

The examiner said, "It is believed that this subject is a white or hispanic adult male between 20 and 40 years of

age. He is approximately 5'6" to 5'10" in height, with dark brown or black hair approximately 1.5" in length."

At the time of discovery, the body was wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt with no markings, a black T-shirt that read, "Total Recall," blue jeans and newer black/gray/white size 10.5 Nike shoes.

FPD discovered a red St.

Louis Cardinals baseball cap near the body.

Detectives believe the cap was purchased at a local donation or thrift store recently.

The man is missing all four wisdom teeth and has two distinctive tattoos — one on the left forearm and one large tattoo on the upper back between the shoulder blades.

As previously released, this death appears to be the

result of a suicide but the circumstances are still under investigation.

Missing person records from Lane, Lincoln and Coos County have been reviewed and at this point there are no known matches.
