

all over the United States and Europe. He and his wife Nancy, who plays the hammered dulcimer, live on a farm near Fall Creek.




He also hosts the International Polka Party, heard on KCST 106.9 FM every Sunday from 4 to 8 a.m. He has been doing this for over a quarter of a century.
