Trailing by 14 entering the second quarter, it's a safe bet no one would've guessed the Vikings would find themselves facing double overtime against the Pirates last Friday against one of the 4A's top-ranked teams.

But thanks to an extraordinary defensive effort against a normally high-scoring Pirates team, the Vikings not only stopped the bleeding — they began the healing process while bat-

tling their way back into the game. Siuslaw went on to hold Marshfield scoreless for the next three quarters. In the meantime, the Vikings cut the Pirates lead to a single touchdown after completing a nine-play, 61-yard drive that ended on a 21-yard touchdown run


