

B&G FOOTBALL TEAM TIES NEWPORT 30-30 IN OT

freshman lineman Blaine Jensen, who had five solo tackles.

"Blaine has his own way of tackling, but he definitely wraps them up," said Greene.

Offensively, the Sailors transformed the opportunities

created by their defense to score eight touchdowns and the same number of conversions.

Packebush chewed up 118 yards of offense, claiming three touchdowns on 10 carries.

Sophomore Dominic Wells was a double threat, catching four passes for 79 yards and rushing seven times for 89 yard and three trips across the goal

line.

At runningback, junior AJ Foster scored twice for the Sailors, running for 201 yards and averaging 28 yards per carry.

"It was a good game for us as we head into Friday," said Greene, whose team will host Siletz in a game that will have major playoff implications.

A win by the Sailors would secure third place in their division of the Mountain West, advancing them to the first round of state playoffs against the top three teams of the league's eastern division.

A loss on Friday would end their state playoff chances but guarantee them a shot at fourth place in a game that would

most likely be against Mohawk.

"It's a big one for us," said Greene. "It's our Homecoming game with a lot riding on the outcome."

two adult coho (in aggregate with other areas with the same bag limit). The lower bay up to the North Fork confluence typically produces the best results early in the season. Lake Creek will not open for

wild coho in 2015.

The cutthroat trout fishery is fair for sea runs in the lower reaches of the river and in upper tide water. Fishing during the early mornings or near the larger tributaries is the most productive.

ALSEA RIVER: *Chinook, coho, cutthroat trout*

The fall Chinook fishery is producing fair to good results for both bank and boat anglers. Anglers are having the best action fishing from the lower bay up to the head of tide. Trolling, casting lures or bobber fishing are all producing depending on the section and conditions.

Bank fishing near the Hwy. 101 bridge or up at the newly opened Don Lindly Park (MP 7 on Hwy. 34) can be good for both Chinook and coho.

SILETZ RIVER: *Chinook, coho, steelhead, cutthroat trout*

The fall Chinook fishery has been producing fair to good results in the lower bay up to the Chinook Bend area.

Chinook can be found through the head of tide but still in small numbers. Trolling or bobber fishing through the high slack seems to be the most productive.

COOS COUNTY LAKES/PONDS: *Largemouth bass, bluegills*

Fishing for largemouth bass and bluegills has been good in many of the Coos County lakes. Fishing for bass will be best in the very early mornings and late evenings.

Fish for bluegills around structure like submerged logs and weed lines.

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
