If you are not on the beach or in the inundation zone, you do not need to take any action.

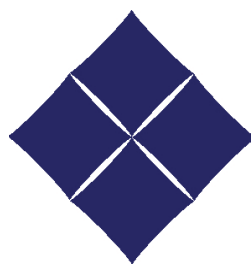
The All Clear “Westminster Chimes” means the danger has passed for the beach
