Two-dimensional items must be framed and wired for hanging; no "sawtooth" hangers are allowed.

Maximum size for flat work is 38 inches measured either horizontally or vertically.

Three-dimensional items must fit into the display case. Maximum accepted size is 12 inches deep by 12 inches by 24 inches.

All entries should be hand-delivered to the Bromley Room of the main library Monday, Nov. 2, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

No shipped items will be accepted.
