

New score for classic film premieres tomorrow

City Lights Cinemas will host the world premiere of a musical new score by award-winning composer Ken Wannberg, a Hollywood stalwart who spent his career working with some of the greatest directors of the age.

Wannberg will be premiering a new original score to the 1920 German Expressionist classic, “The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari,” on Thursday, Oct. 29, at 7 p.m.

Tickets are \$10 for City Lights members and \$15 for general admission.

Wannberg spent more than 40 years as an accomplished sound editor and composer and is best know for his work with John Williams, Steven Spielberg and George Lucas.

Wannberg remained active in Hollywood through 2005, finishing his career with projects for Spielberg’s “Memoirs of a

Geisha,” and “Munich.”

A lifelong dream of Wannberg’s has been to compose and play an original score for “The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari.”

This silent film is “a perfect Halloween selection,” says Michael Falter, co-owner of City Lights Cinemas.

Falter will provide a brief introduction to the film and Wannberg’s career.
