### Florence Municipal Court Nov. 10

Kourtney Sue Burns pleaded no contest to possession of a forged instrument and attempted possession of a controlled substance. She was sentenced to 90 days in Florence City Jail and must report to treatment. She must pay \$850 in fines and not contact or be in or about the premises or place of employment of the victim.

Brandy Lee Saxton pleaded guilty to theft. She was sentenced to four days in Florence City Jail. She must pay \$475 in fines and not contact or be in or about the residence or place of employment of the victim.

Brian Thomas Woods pleaded no contest to four counts of theft and one count of criminal trespass. He was sentenced to nine days in Florence City Jail and must report to Emergence Addiction and Mental Health Services.
