MID COAST LAKES The coho salmon fisheries in Sletcoos and Tahkentich lakes are slow to fair. This time of year is typically the most productive. Recent rains and big tide should help to move new fish into the
lakes.
The West Lake Boat Ramp at Siltcoos has been
close for repairs but there close for repairs but there is a neighboring private ramp that can be utilized. Look to fish near the lake outlet and by the major lakes. Casting or trolling lakes. Casting or trolling
spinners or various plugs spinners or varie.
can be effective.
Fishing for the various warm water fish species tends to be slower during the winter months. There are numerous lakes in the Florence area that can provide good opportunity and have both boat and bank
access.
SIUSLAW RIVER:

The fall Chinook fishery is very slow and basically over for the season. Any remaining fish are in spawning condition. December is considered to be the start of the winter steelhead run. Look for small numbers of fish to be in the lower river above the head of tide this early in the season. Casting lures or bobber fishing can be productive
