Dunes City hearing on septic proposal postponed

The Dunes City Council's scheduled hearing on proposed Ordinance Number 228, proposing amendments to the current Code regarding septic maintenance, has been postponed until the March regular meeting of the City Council.

"Councilor Ken Platt will be unavailable to attend the Council meeting on Jan. 14," said Acting City Administrator, Jamie Mills. "The other City Councilors have expressed concern that because this issue is so important, all Councilors should be here to participate."

For that reason, Mayor Rebecca Ruede decided to remove the planned hearing from January's agenda and place in on the March 10, 2016 agenda.
