Sailors teams unable to top Triangle Lake

It was a tale of two halves for the Mapleton girls Friday night, as they played the third place Lakers (6-2) to a virtual stalemate during the first two periods.

Trailing 18-16 entering the half, the Lady Sailors quickly found

themselves down 28-16 just four minutes into the third quarter.

The only scoring for the Sailors came from freshman post Alyssa Richards, who sank two baskets in the period as Triangle Lake moved ahead 34-20 to start the final quarter.

Richards went on to lead Mapleton with 13 points, nine rebounds, one steal and two blocked shots.

Alexis Gierke and Destiny Weber had four points each, along with two

points each from Hannah Rodet and Josi Hays. The Lakers began the fourth period with four consecutive steals to take a 40-20 lead en route to a 46-26 win.

In the boys game, the Sailors kept things close throughout the first

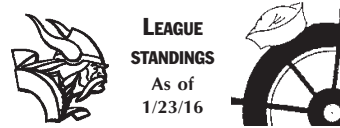
MID COAST LAKES

The coho salmon fisheries in Siltcoos and Tahkenitch lakes are slow to fair. This time of year is typically the most productive. Recent rains and big tide should help to move new fish into the lakes.

The West Lake Boat Ramp at Siltcoos has been close for repairs but there is a neighboring private ramp that can be utilized. Look to fish near the lake outlet and by the major tributaries that enter the lakes. Casting or trolling spinners or various plugs can be effective.

After nine hours of bowling, both the Siuslaw boys and girls teams qualified for the annual Oregon State bowling championships during last Sunday's District 4 competition at Firs Bowl in Eugene.

The Lady Vikings qualified by finishing third behind North Bend and district champion Cottage Grove.

The Viking boys became Siuslaw's first District 4 championship team in the history of the program.

In competition, the teams started

Siuslaw teams bounced by Brookings

The Viking girls took on the Far West League's first place and undefeated (3-0) Bruins at Brookings-Harbor on Friday, where cold shooting kept Siuslaw from closing the gap against the 4A's No. 6-ranked team.

Though junior guard Destinie Tatum had 10 points and nine rebounds,

accounting for nearly half of the Vikings' scoring, Siuslaw made only 12 of 43 attempts from the field as a team.

From the charity line, the Viks missed 10 out of 12 shots.

Meanwhile, the Bruins' Siena Worthey and Drew Farmer each scored
