

The year 2015 was a successful fundraising year for the Cultural Trust. A record amount will be available for grants, which last year totaled more than \$2.6 million.

Cultural Development Grants represent one third of the annual funding the Trust provides to Oregon's cultural nonprofits.

Other funding includes grants to the trust's five statewide partners — to support their projects and respective grant programs — and to 45 county and tribal cultural coalitions that fund local ini-
