Free monthly discussions on legal issues for seniors

Kelly Ford, an Oregon attorney new to the Florence area, has agreed to hold casual, monthly discussions on legal issues important to seniors at the Florence Senior Center.

Beginning at 1 p.m. on April 6, and continuing on the first Wednesday of each month, Ford will be available for dropin talks. Themes can include estate planning, wills and trusts and other tools and techniques used by estate planners.

Ford will open with a specific topic, but the dialogues can change depending on the needs and questions of those attending.

Discussion topics will include:

• April 6: Common Estate planning mistakes and how to avoid them

• May 4: Estate settlement tools (Or: not everything goes through probate)

June 1: The declining need for revocable trusts in Oregon estate planning

• July 6: When are guardianship and conservatorship necessary?

• Aug. 3: Planning for Medicaid to pay for long-term care in Oregon

Ford has been practicing in the Beaverton area for about 30 years and offered similar discussions at the senior center there.

"We are excited to be able to offer this kind of information to Florence-area seniors," said Christine May, senior center board president. "Although the topics are geared to seniors, anyone interested is invited to attend."

The legal discussions are free, but participants are asked to contribute \$1 per session to help defray operating costs for the Senior Center.
