

The grants will contribute to a location rental for a drug- and alcohol-free post-graduation celebration, purchase cots for the shelter, assist CROW in its building renovations and help Food Share with needed building improvements.

The Easter Egg Hunt will start promptly at 10 a.m., and it only takes a few minutes for




