WLCF awards grants to 39 nonprofit organizations

So far, 2016 is proving to be a very good year for 39 nonprofit recipients from throughout western Lane County who received grants totaling \$71.000.

Recipients were awarded checks at the Rotary Club of Florence meeting on Tuesday, March 15. These funds will further projects that fall within the four Western Lane Community Foundation grant criteria areas of focus; culture, medicine/science, education



and social/civic services.

WLCF received 56 applications requesting over \$176,000 in funds.

This year's grants covered a wide range of projects, including partnering with the Central Oregon Coast Amateur Radio Club as it establishes an emergency field deployable communications trailer; both Mapleton and Siuslaw School districts, which are benefiting by several projects funded to enhance the students educational curriculum that are not covered with regular school district funding, such as oneon-one computers and online academic subscriptions; both Mapleton and Siuslaw elementary, which will use the grants to receive library books; and at the district, a grant to replace the audiometer for conducting hearing evaluations. The arts were represented as well, including SEAcoast Entertainment's "Living Voices Educational Theater" Project, and FloTones music

library upgrade. Florence and Mapleton Food Share received funds to help maintain and upgrade their equipment vital to serving the needy.

The Rotary Club of Florence established the Western Lane Community Foundation in 1974 as a community trust, a private nonprofit organization to attract, administer and distribute private charitable resources for the benefit of residents in western Lane County.

Through these resources the Foundation helps sustain and enhance the quality of life in

western Lane County by supporting non-profit organizations operating in all fields of interest.

The Foundation manages current assets of \$5,000,000, which consist of Designated Funds; assets that are established by donors to support certain organizations, Field of Interest Funds; donors who set a criteria of a particular area of community service that they want the grant distributed to, and general funds; which are flexible resources the foundation can apply to address changing community needs.
