

# Vikings land multiple medals in J. City

On the mound for Siuslaw was Mapleton freshman Gabe Simington, who struck out 10 and allowed only four hits in six innings as the Vikings opened the doubleheader with a 12-2 win.

Junior hurler Michael Larson started on the mound in game two, where he got the win, with senior relief pitcher Kenneth Thrall coming in for the save to preserve a 7-5 win over the Tigers.

Thursday, Siuslaw will wrap up nonleague play by hosting Pleasant Hill at 4:30 p.m., then open the Far West season Friday in a doubleheader at home against Marshfield, beginning at 3 p.m.
