Music teacher Jessica Treon of Seal Rock will host her students for her final recital at the Community Baptist Church in Florence this Sunday, May 1, at 5 p.m.

"I would like to invite any and all of my former students and their families to join us," said Treon. "The recital program will be short and as always will be followed by refreshments with each family contributing a plate of cookies or other finger foods."

"It would be wonderful to see some families from my past 20 years of teaching in Florence."

In 1996, Treon moved with her husband to the Oregon Coast. They settled in Yachats as they were both to be self-employed and wanted to be located between Florence and Newport until they saw which way their businesses would grow. Shortly after moving here, word traveled to Florence that a piano teacher with 20 years of experience was hoping to become estab-

lished on the coast. Shortly thereafter, Treon was contacted by piano teacher and then owner of Video 123, John Polese, of Florence.

He wanted to move to Eugene to go back to school and wanted to refer his students to qualified piano teachers.

He found Treon a location, Community Baptist Church, and even loaned her a piano to use temporarily and lessons began.

Over the years, Treon promoted and taught her preschool program, Polly Panda Music, her Kinder Keyboard Classes and private piano lessons at the church.

During road closures, she drove logging roads and stayed overnight one night a week with clients in Florence. At times she made the trip to Florence three times a week.

Treon has hosted piano recitals twice a year and brought Oregon Music Teachers Association Syllabus adjudicators to evaluate her students in Florence.

"Florence has been very good to me, and I will miss my families and students here," said Treon. "I have plenty of students at my house in Seal Rock. I'm not retiring from teaching piano, but I am retiring from driving 70 miles round trip to do it."

Learn more about older adult behavioral health

The public is invited to attend the May meeting of the Florence Area Community Coalition (FACC) Wednesday, May 4, from 9 to 10:30 a.m. in the Bromley Room at the Siuslaw Public Library.

The speaker will be Christopher Eilers, M.A., LPC., an Older Adult Behavioral Health (OABH) specialist from Trillium Behavioral Health Service.

He will talk about older adult mental health problems and how OABH specialists can help navigate the mental health system. Eilers will cover the most common symptoms

and conditions that accompany the aging process, and when to get professional help.

Many elderly people suffer from depression, and dementia is common. However, there is help. If you have a friend or family member with any of these conditions or behaviors, this will be an opportunity to garner resources to offer support.

May is also National Mental Health Awareness Month.

Also at the meeting, the FACC will present a \$500 college scholarship to a local high school senior who has been selected especially for involve-

ment in community service and volunteer work.

The mission of the FACC is to improve the quality of life in Western Lane County through partnership, networking, volunteerism, community involvement, education and awareness. This year's scholarship recipient manifests this mission.

Each month, FACC selects a local service project or agency to support. This month's featured project is the Siuslaw Elementary School garden.

Anyone who would like to donate hand tools, gloves, potting soil, seeds or seedlings, or

make a cash donation can bring them to the meeting to be delivered to the school garden project.

Also at the May 4 meeting, the board will be accepting nominations for board members for the coming year in preparation for its annual election at the June 1 meeting.

Anyone interested in serving on the board of directors for FACC should attend.

The board meets monthly to direct the affairs of FACC.
