Coast Guard rescues fishing vessel — twice

The U.S. Coast Guard Station Siuslaw River came to the rescue of the 52-foot fishing vessel Takako Thursday afternoon for the second time in 48 hours.

In the early hours of Wednesday morning, May 25, the first call for assistance was received from the disabled commercial fishing vessel. The 47-foot Motor Life Boat (MLB) went to the aid of the Takako, but was unable to tow it in due to low tide on the Siuslaw River.

The two vessels circled outside the bar for several hours, waiting for higher tides. About 1 p.m., the Takako was successfully towed to a dock near Old Town, where the captain sought repairs.

Thursday afternoon, May 26, after repairs were finished, the Takako requested a safety standby as they went back out across the bar. The safety standby occurred without incident. However, a short time later, the station received another call for assistance

from the same vessel, now again mechanically disabled. The MLB responded and towed the vessel back to the docks.

Station Siuslaw River's Officer in Charge, Senior Chief Tim Tregoning, stated, "We commend the skipper for requesting assistance on his outbound voyage. Often

times, you don't know if effective repairs were made until sea trials are complete. The bar is a dangerous location to discover repairs were not effective.

"We encourage mariners to contact the nearest Coast Guard Station when they have concerns about crossing the hazardous bars along the

Florence Municipal Court May 24

Ronald Dean Beason pleaded no contest to hit-and-run property damage and a misdemeanor for driving with a suspended driver's license. He was sentenced 10 to days in Florence City Jail. He must pay \$2,884 in fines and not contact or be in or about the residence or place of employment of the victim.

Byron Leroy Barnett pleaded no contest to disorderly conduct and criminal mischief. He must report to Emergence Addiction and Mental Health Services. He must pay \$325 in fines and not contact or be in or about the premises or place of employment of the

victim.

Richard Dennis Ruehle pleaded guilty to criminal mischief. He must pay \$475 in fines.

James Byron Lawson Jr. pleaded guilty to theft. He was sentenced to four days in Florence City Jail and must report to Emergence Addiction and Mental Health Services. He must pay \$525 in fines and not contact or be in or about the premises or place of employment of the victim.

William James Hoey pleaded no contest to theft. He was sentenced to eight days in Florence City Jail. He must pay \$475 in fines and not contact or be in or about the residence or place of employment of the victim.

Agencies conduct active shooter training

West Lane Emergency Operations Group (WLEOG) agencies will be at Siuslaw Middle School on Saturday, June 4, to conduct an active shooter response exercise. The exercise is scheduled to start at 8 a.m. and will conclude around 2 p.m.

The exercise is not open to the public and citizens are asked to avoid the area during the exercise.

Through traffic will be restricted in the areas surrounding the exercise. Areas of restriction include Oak Street from 20th to 27th streets and on 27th Street from Oak to Kingwood streets. Florence Public Works staff will be on scene to direct traffic.

Prior to the exercise, the Florence Police Department will issue a community alert to the surrounding area as a reminder that the exercise will be taking place. Alerts will automatically reach land-lines in the designated area. The public can opt-in for mobile alerts at public.alert.sense.com/SignUp.

Normal emergency response operations and hospital operations will not be affected by the drill.

The exercise will be primarily centered at Siuslaw Middle School, but will also include Siuslaw Elementary School and Siuslaw High School. This multi-agency exercise will test the preparedness, coordination, and response of local agencies should a real disaster occur.

Emergency staff and drill participants with mock injuries may be seen by motorists and pedestrians in the area. Citizens may also

hear drill communication over the police, fire, EMS and other emergency response radio frequencies between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m.

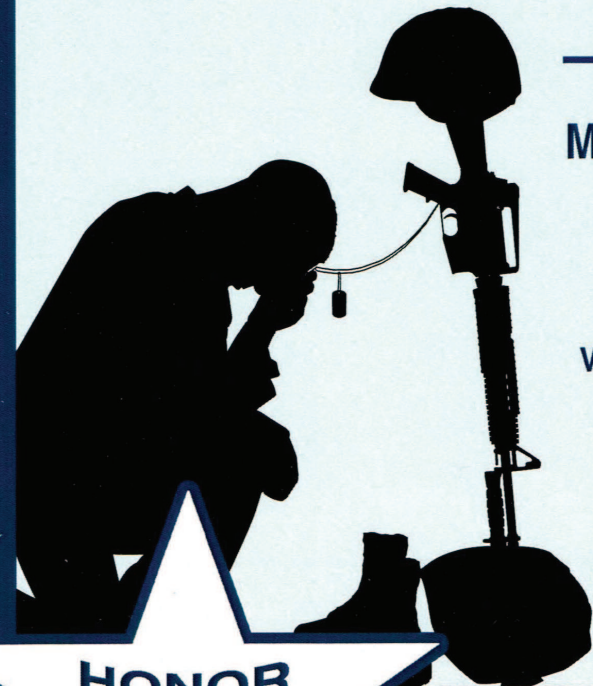
