60th ANNIVERSARY

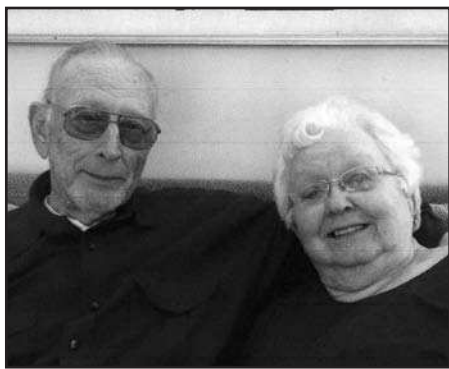
Alice and Alfred Owens
