

City Lights to screen classic ‘One Flew Over the Cuckoo’s Nest’

City Lights Cinemas will show the Academy Award-winning film, “One Flew Over the Cuckoo’s Nest” at noon and 6 p.m. Thursday, June 9.

The screening is in support of Lane Community College Florence Center’s planned visit later this summer to Salem’s Museum of Mental Health, housed at Oregon State Hospital, where the movie was filmed.

The screenings are open to the general public, though those interested in the upcoming Florence Center Outward Ventures’ trip on Aug. 3 to the Museum of Mental Health are encouraged to attend.

Florence Center Continuing Education program coordinator, Marsha Sills, will share details about the museum visit prior to the noon screening.

The small and unique muse-

um features exhibits on the history of the facility, its patients and employees and its patients’ contributions to the film’s production.

The hospital’s then-superintendent Dean Brooks also had a role in the film.

“We’re appreciative of City Lights’ Michael Falter for helping us enrich this experience for our continuing education students,” Sills said. “We also

encourage students to read the book. To say that the Hollywood adaptation didn’t win author Ken Kesey’s approval is a bit of an understatement.

“Kesey filed suit against the film’s producers, which included Michael Douglas, over his objections to the screenplay’s deviation from his own work.”

The differences between the book and film will be one of the topics discussed during a book club-style chat planned later this summer in preparation for the museum visit, Sills said.

“Attending the movie screening and book club discussion aren’t required to make

this trip,” Sills said. “We’re merely offering both as opportunities for our students to engage more fully in conversations about the issues raised in the work. Also, watching the film will provide context for those who plan to make the trip with us to the museum since one of the exhibits is specific to the film’s production.”

While Kesey rejected the film, it found wild success with audiences.

“Most writers lament their work’s adaptation to the screen as it is their imagination that is impossible to recapture with the collaborative art of film,” Falter said, “but it is important

to note that the film won a whopping five Oscars (and was nominated for nine), including Best Picture, Actor, Actress, Director and Adapted Screenplay.

“We’re excited to have it on the big screen again.”
