Sanford carries Viks past Panthers

Siuslaw senior fullback Brent Sanford rushed for 234 yards and three touchdowns in the Vikings' 28-0 victory over the Gold Beach Panthers last Friday at Petersen Memorial Field.

"It was a very good offensive football game," said Viking coach Len Lutero.

The 234-yard mark now stands as the third-best total ever by a Viking running back — it surpassed the 227-yard total amassed by Tyler Woosley, set in 1988 against Roodport.

"Brent wanted to get 230 yards of offense in the game," Lutero said.

Sanford set the Vikings' all-time record of 315 yards rushing at Gold Beach last year, and his career total

of 2,843 is just 157 short of 3,000 yards, with two games left on the Vikings' schedule.

Sanford got the Vikings off to a good start in this game with a 25-yard run midway through the first quarter — completing a five-play drive and putting the Vikings ahead, 7-0.

Viking quarterback Andy Rodet directed the Viking offensive team to its second score. The drive encompassed five minutes of the clock and 13 plays before Sanford plunged across the goal line to increase the lead to 14-0 with 9:52 left in the second quarter.

Sanford had a 38-yard run during the drive, and Rodet kept the rally going with a 15-yard run on a fourth-down play.

Rodet finished the game with

SIUSLAW TO RECOGNIZE ITS ATHLETIC BEST

Eight individuals and two teams, spanning nearly 40 years of Siuslaw athletics history, will be inducted into this year's Siuslaw Athletics Hall of Fame. The selection process began last September with nominees that had carried over from previous years, along with new nominees submitted by community members.

This year's group is the largest to date, with athletes representing individual achievement in basketball, football, wrestling, track and field and cross country — including a member of the very first girls' track team in 1965, Toni Winthers-Stonelake.

In the team category, the first state

championship boys cross country team, as well as the 1997 state championship boys track team, will be honored.

Come the night of Aug. 19, the following athletes will be inducted into Siuslaw's hallowed Athletics Hall of Fame:

Harold McClellan (1958): A three-sport athlete, McClellan was a standout in football, basketball and track, leading Siuslaw on the gridiron as a halfback with touchdown runs of 50 and 44 yards to upset undefeated Toledo in the 1957 playoffs.

In basketball and track, McClellan was one of the Vikings' top scorers his junior and senior years.

Les Conley (1965): As a junior in 1964, Conley won the 100-yard dash in a blistering 10.2 seconds, then placed second in the 180-yard low hurdles in 20.2. In 1965, Conley placed second at state in the 100-yard

STEP to share essential salmon fishing tips tonight

Relying on his vast experience as an angler on the Oregon coast, Ron Caputo, president of the Salmon and Trout Enhancement Program (STEP), will share his 12 tips for a successful salmon season tonight, Aug. 3, at the monthly STEP meeting.

The club meets at 7 p.m. at the Elks' Lodge in Florence, and the public is invited to attend.

Caputo will also share his recipe for

brining herring as anglers ready for the fall chinook season. Caputo has fished the Siuslaw for many years and will talk about his favorite fishing holes, strategies for when and where to fish, what to do to prepare for the fishing day and other strategies.

Prior to his talk, the club will hold a short business meeting with reports from the treasurer, recent work parties, planned work in the fall and current

fishing reports.

The STEP group is under the auspices of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

It is an all-volunteer organization with a mission to return fisheries to historic levels through habitat restoration, education programs and a broodstock program for winter steelhead.

MID COAST LAKES:

Rainbow trout stocking is complete along the mid coast. Holdover trout will be available in most lakes through the summer.

Fishing for the various warm water fish species is good this time of year as fish move to the shallows for spawning. There are numerous lakes in the Florence area that can provide good opportunity.

SIUSLAW RIVER: Cutthroat

For cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective. Angling for all species in streams above tidewater is restricted to artificial flies and lures until Sept. 1. Casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.

ALSEA RIVER: Cutthroat

The Alsea River is open for cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective. Bait is not allowed above the head of tide until Sept. 1.

SILETZ RIVER: Steelhead, cutthroat

Steelhead fishing is fair. This run typically peaks by early July. Casting spinners, drifting bait or using a bobber and jig can be effective. Cover water and fish small and simple as the river conditions are low and clear. For cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.

WILSON RIVER: Steelhead, Chinook, cutthroat

Fishing for steelhead and spring Chinook is slow. The water is low and clear, so use lighter gear and target the deeper holding areas. Trout angling should be fair.

YAQUINA RIVER: Cutthroat

For cutthroat trout casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective. Angling for all species in streams above tidewater is restricted to artificial flies and lures until Sept. 1.

COOS COUNTY LAKES AND PONDS: Trout, warmwater fish

There are trout available for kids in the Millicoma Pond at the Millicoma
