
Military Museum unveils new Iraq display

At the anniversary celebration held July 2, the Oregon Coast Military Museum unveiled its latest diorama, which depicts a U.S. military convoy traveling through a typical Iraqi village during Desert Storm, built in 1:72 scale.

It is full of amazing detail depicting life in that middleeast venue complete with structures, villagers, convoy vehicles and even extreme detail down to laundry hanging on the line and fruit and vegetables in the farmer's market.

The diorama, about 32 square feet, sits on top of a display of other artifacts of the same period and military discipline.

The entire display was a collaboration of effort by Judy Murphy, who built the village itself and was the driving force behind the full-scale dioramas in the museum, Chief of Staff
