

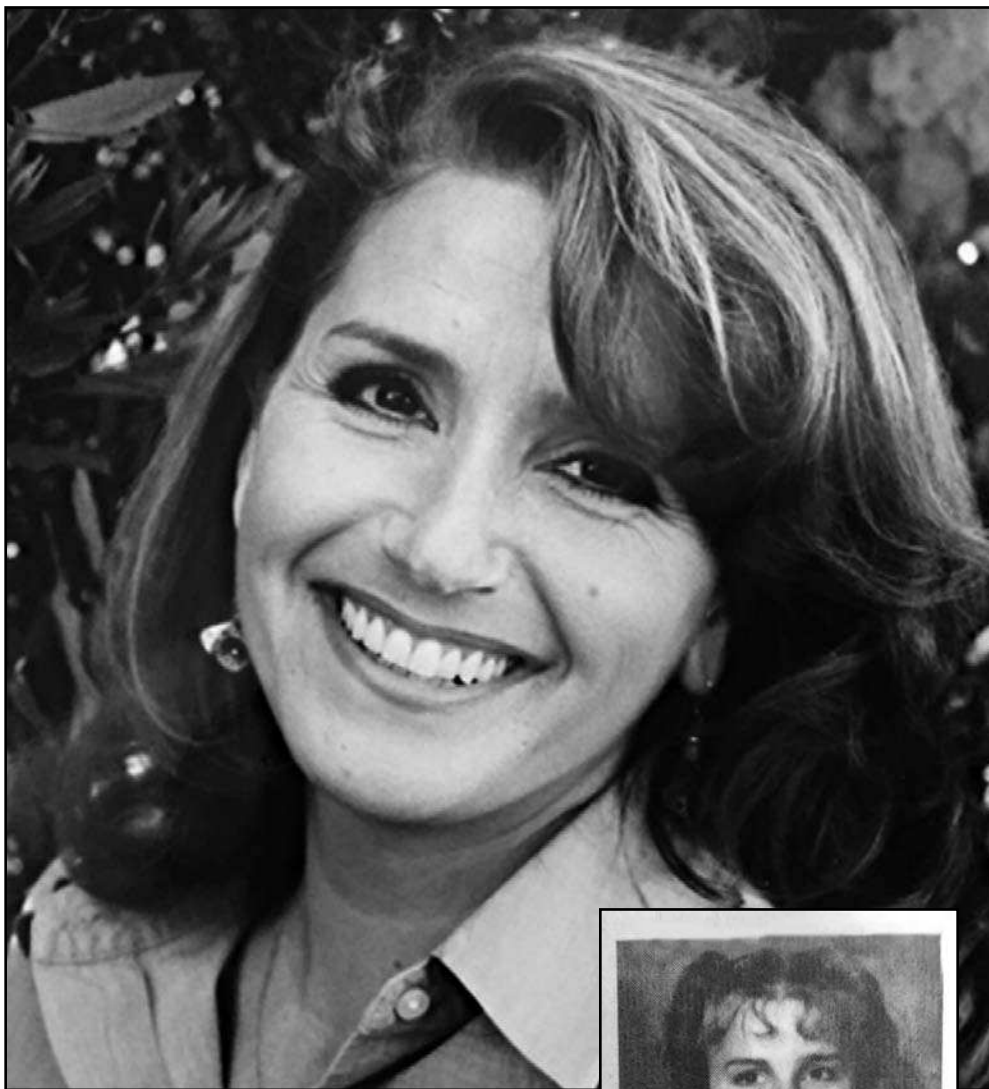
# Remembering Liz Mobley

Elizabeth “Liz” Larue Mobley was born July 1, 1960, to parents Lois and Chester “Chet” Hostick in Ontario, Ore. Liz was the youngest of the six Hostick children and spent most of her youth and adult life in the Florence area.

After graduating from Siuslaw High School in 1978, Liz immediately went on to honorably serve her country in the U.S. Army, working as a computer programmer at the Pentagon in Virginia.

After her military service, she worked in a variety of jobs including a long stint as a waitress at Morgan’s Country Kitchen, a butcher at Thriftway and sales associate at



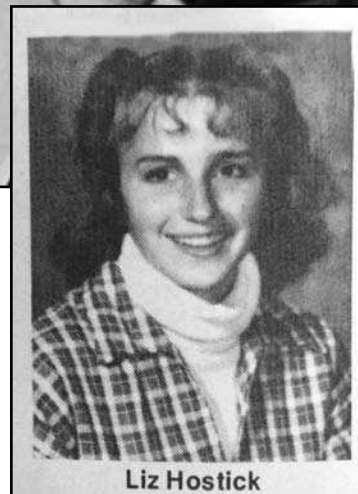
**Liz Mobley in 2015 and at Siuslaw High School in 1978**
