## Mayor proclaims Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

At the Aug. 15 Florence City Council meeting, Mayor Joe Henry proclaimed September as Prostate Cancer Awareness Month in the City of Florence.

In presenting the proclamation to Us TOO Florence facilitator Bob Horney, Henry shared the following information:

- Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed non-skin cancer in men and the second leading cause of cancer death in men. In 2016, approximately 180,890 men in the United States will be diagnosed with prostate cancer (2,490 in Oregon) and about 26,120 men will lose their lives to this disease (410 in Oregon).
- Men will seldom experience any symptoms when diagnosed at the most curable stage. Five-year survival rates are nearly 100 percent when diagnosed with localized or regional disease, but it drops to only 28 percent among men diagnosed with metastatic disease.

Us TOO Florence urges all men to establish a baseline PSA at age 40, along with a DRE (digital rectal exam) and risk assessment.

Us TOO Florence has two monthly meetings with Urologist Dr. Bryan Mehlhaff

attending the evening meeting on the second Tuesday of each month, and Urologist Dr. Roger McKimmy attending the lunch meeting on the third Tuesday of each month.

Mayor Henry urged all men in Florence to take advantage

of the information available at Us TOO Florence meetings, become aware of their own risks of prostate cancer, talk to their health providers and get screened for the disease.
