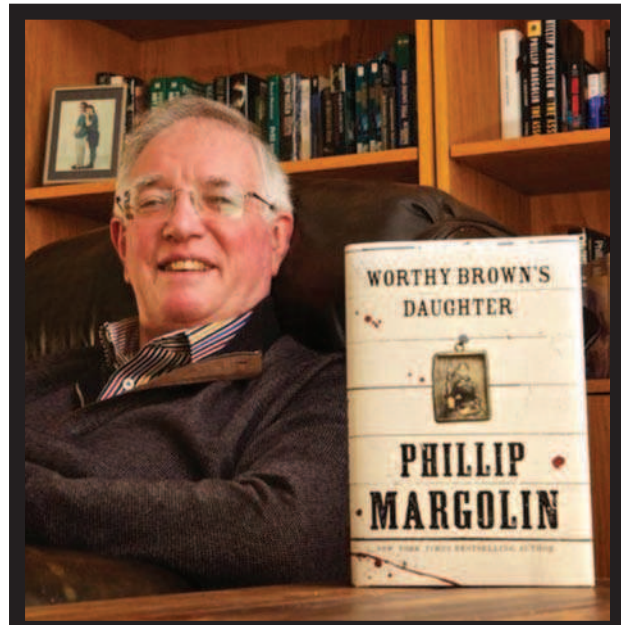
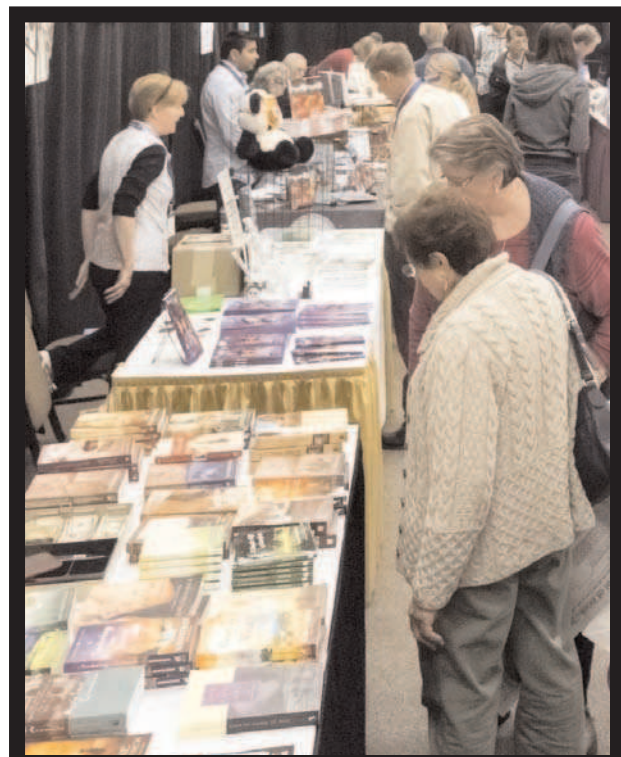

Festival of Books

If you have a favorite Northwest author, want to find a new one or are ready to find a publisher for your own book, the sixth annual Florence Festival of Books (FFOB) is your chance to meet and talk with authors and publishers firsthand.

Eighty authors and nine publishers from throughout the Northwest and parts of California will be on hand for this year's festival on Saturday, Sept. 24 at the Florence Events Center, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Come chat with the authors, purchase books and have them signed and per-



sonalized — with no admission charge. This year will see about 30 new authors participating, as well as many returning authors with their latest pub-

lished works available.

Because this is a book fair for publishers as well, there will be about 10 publishers participating, several of which are new this year to the festival.

If you have a book idea or a manuscript that is either finished or in progress, this is an opportunity to pitch it to a potential publisher.

The authors and publishers represent many genres, including fiction, nonfiction, memoir, children's books, young adult, western, mystery, humor, poetry
