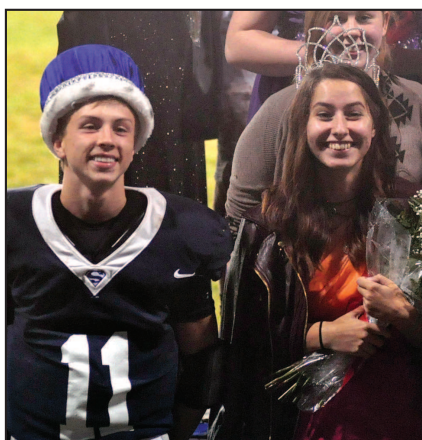
SAILORS CAGE WOLVERINES

Win underscores homecoming celebration

It didn't take much time for the Sailors to get a handle on the Wolverines during last Friday's homecoming football game at Mapleton High School.

About one quarter to be exact. Leading 32-8 heading into the second period, Mapleton made it clear that it had every intention of securing a win during one of the biggest nights of the year.

The Sailors' new cross country team was on the road at Pleasant Hill Saturday at Elijah Bristow State Park, where junior Cole Spencer and freshman Richy Gastelum were joined by

freshman Nathen Roane in his cross country debut after playing on the Mapleton gridiron the night before.

"Our guys ran well on Saturday," said coach Aaron Longo.

Spencer and Gastelum each ran personal bests on the 5K course, with Spencer posting a 24.9-second

improvement to finish in 21:20.0.

Gastelum ran 21:26.3 for a 13.9-second personal best.

ALSEA RIVER: Cutthroat, Chinook

The Alsea River and bay is open for Chinook salmon through Dec. 31. Fishing is slow but will pick up over the next several weeks. Trolling herring in the lower bay is an effective technique. Eggs and bobber or drifting eggs can be productive in the upper bay and river as the season progresses.

SIUSLAW RIVER: Cutthroat, Chinook

The Siuslaw River and bay is open for Chinook salmon through Dec. 31. Fishing is slow but will pick up over the next several weeks. Trolling herring in the lower bay is an effective technique. Eggs and bobber or drifting eggs can be productive in the upper bay and river as the season progresses.

For cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective. Angling for all species in streams above tidewater is now open. Casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.

SALMON RIVER: Cutthroat, Chinook

The Salmon River and bay is open for Chinook salmon through Dec. 31. Fishing is slow but will pick up over the next several weeks. Trolling herring in the lower bay is an effective technique. Eggs and bobber or drifting eggs can be productive in the upper bay and river as the season progresses. Parking can be limited at Knight Park during the fall salmon return.

SILETZ RIVER: Steelhead, cutthroat, Chinook

The Siletz River and bay is open for Chinook salmon through Dec. 31.
