An estimated 500 people attended the Aging In Place symposium Friday, Sept. 16, at the Florence Events Center, presented by the Florence Area Community Coalition (FACC) and co-sponsored by Habitat for Humanity, PeaceHealth Peace Harbor Medical Center, the City of Florence and American Association of Retired Persons. In addition to 30 exhibitors providing information and resources to help older adults maintain an independent lifestyle while living at home, presentations were made on six topics including wellness, safety and emergency, home repair assistance, basic estate planning, fraud and theft prevention, volunteering and employment opportunities. "FACC's motivation in organizing this event was to educate and provide information and resources so our community members can develop personal and collective plans of action to address the needs of our aging citizens," FACC board member Suzanne Mann-Heintz said.

Library Friends seek donations to keep 'Eco'

The Friends of the Siuslaw Public Library is asking for donations to keep Eco the Sea Lion at the library.

The live auction for the Dancing with Sea Lions pub-

lic art project will be Saturday, Oct. 8, and the Library Friends have until then to raise the funds needed to purchase Eco to keep it at the library before it goes up for auction.

Since April, when Eco went on display in front of the Florence branch of the library, it has generated lots of attention, many special visits and countless photos with visitors and residents alike.

"Eco is a fantastic interactive learning opportunity," said Library Director Meg Spencer. "We can take children to see the art and ask: How many fish can you find on Eco? or Which ecosystems are depicted on Eco?"

"Eco and the Ecosystems of Oregon" was created by Siuslaw High School student and regular library patron Ben Cahoon. Eco is part of a public art project, Dancing with Sea Lions, which commemorates the Florence Events Center's 20th Anniversary and celebrates the ripple effect of the arts in the community.

Friends of the Library pres-

ident Annie Schmidt is thrilled to support this project that links the arts and the library.

"It's just super. I'm all in on this," said Schmidt. Eco is one of 10 unique sea lion sculptures that will be sold at the live auction Oct. 8 at the FEC.

The starting bid for each of the sea lions is set at \$1,996 — the year that the FEC opened.

Any funds raised that are not used to buy Eco at the auction will be reserved for future public art purchases by the library.

"We really want to keep Eco at the library, but we don't know how high the bidding will go," Spencer said. "This way, if the auction price exceeds what we've raised, or if we have funds left over, we can use them to add to our public art collection in the future."
