VIKS SHOW WELL AT WOAHINK

In a field of powerhouse teams from all divisions, including 6A leader Central Catholic, both Viking cross country teams had strong showings during Saturday's Woahink Invitational at Honeyman State Park.

The course, noted for its difficult combination of turns, narrow trails and hills, isn't the kind of place where personal bests are clocked. But on Saturday, sophomore Kaeli Ramos had a season-best (22:40.2) to finish second on the Viks, followed by freshman

Anne Wartnik with a PR at 22:47.4 for the team's third-best finish of the day.

Senior Destinie Tatum, the defending 4A 800-meter state champion, was fourth on the Viks at 23:34.1, with freshmen Hannah Rannow (23:47.2) and Chloe Madden (23:47.9) taking Siuslaw's fifth- and sixth-place slots,

Sailors fall despite record-breaking offense

In most cases, 72 points would be more than enough to secure a football victory, even in 8-man football.

But Friday's barnburner at Mapleton High School wasn't like most cases as the Sailors took on undefeated Yoncalla during a night of explosive offense from both ends of the field.

Senior runningback Tyler Packebush had 169 yards rushing en route to scoring three touchdowns on

When the game was over, the 108-72 score broke the Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) record for most combined points

Vikings' battle not enough to beat top-ranked Bulldogs, 63-26

Friday's football game at home against Far West rival North Bend started out favorably for the Vikings, who began the night with a 65-yard

opening drive that ended in a 28-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback Jared Brandt to fellow junior receiver Trent Reavis.

Though Brandt had missed the previous week's game due to injury, he went on to throw for 205 yards and

three touchdowns against the top-ranked Bulldogs, connecting with junior Quincy Rusk and senior Brogan Cornish along with Reavis.

But North Bend quickly answered Siuslaw's opening drive, scoring three consecutive touchdowns in just over

three minutes to go up 21-6 to start the second quarter.

Just before the half, the Vikings got some spark when the Vikings put together a 70-yard drive that ended with

MID COAST LAKES:
Rainbow trout stocking is complete along the mid coast. Holdover trout will be available in most lakes through the summer. Fishing for the various warm water fish species is good this time of year. There are numerous lakes in the Florence area that can provide good opportunity.

SIUSLAW RIVER:
Cutthroat, Chinook
The Siuslaw River and bay is open for Chinook salmon. Fishing is fair. Trolling herring in the lower bay is an effective technique. Eggs and bobber can be productive in the upper bay and river as the season progresses.

For cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.
