The Vikings were on the road at South Umpqua last Friday, where they fell 40-6 to the Lancers in a game where the Vikings had only 26 players in the lineup. Among those missing

from the roster were key starters Quincy Rusk at runningback and Evan Teter at wide receiver.

The Vikings' only touchdown came in the fourth quarter, beginning with a fumble recovery by freshman Dayson Foglio on a missed pass by the Lancers.

The recovery gave Siuslaw posses-

sion on its own 40-yard line. From there, the Vikings strung together eight plays, with backup quarterback Trent Reavis claiming 44 yards on three carries. The last five of those yards came on a keeper by Reavis that brought him

MID COAST LAKES:
Rainbow trout stocking is complete along the mid coast. Holdover trout will be available in most lakes through the summer. Fishing for the various warm water fish species is good this time of year. There are numerous lakes in the Florence area that can provide good opportunity.

SIUSLAW RIVER:
Cutthroat, Chinook
The Siuslaw River and bay is open for Chinook salmon. Fishing is fair. Trolling herring in the lower bay is an effective technique. Eggs and bobber can be productive in the upper bay and river as the season progresses.

For cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.

Angling for all species in streams above tidewater is open. Casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.
