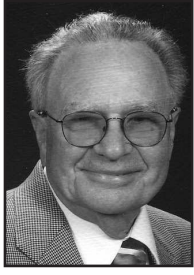

## OBITUARY

**COOK**—Wilmer John “Bud” Cook passed away Sept. 18, 2016, from liver cancer in Florence.

He was born April 9, 1927, in Randolph, Vt., the son of Dana Harrison

and Dorothy Alvarett Farr. At Brattleboro High School, he played on a state champion football team. Shortly after graduating from high school in 1945, he was inducted into the US Navy and served for a year aboard the aircraft carrier USS Leyte (CV32) on an anti-aircraft cannon crew. Following the war, he continued his naval service in the reserves, eventually departing

from the service with the rank of lieutenant commander in 1970. He attended Purdue University on the G.I. Bill, earning a bachelor’s of science degree in electrical engineering in 1950. Residing in Claremont, Calif., he worked for General Dynamics from 1952 until his retirement in 1982, spending most of his career analyzing

test flights of naval surface-to-air missiles. After his retirement, he was active in the Episcopal Church and in various charitable activities, including Habitat for Humanity, first in Plumas County, Calif., until 2004 and then in Florence. He was married to Gloria

Mary Dyer from 1952 to 1969, and to Mary Judith Stewart from 1970 until his death. He is survived by Mary and by his brother, Wendell; his sister Carol; his sons Anthony and Vincent Cook; stepsons Robert and Timothy Stewart; grandchildren Tamara Dirks, John, Matthew and Chris Stewart,

Theresa, Marie, Anthony and Giuseppe Cook; and great-granddaughter Sienna Dow. Memorial Services will be held Saturday, Oct. 29, at St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church in Florence, beginning at 11 a.m. Burns’s Riverside Chapel is in charge of all arrangements.
