## Booster Club offering scholarships for sports fees

The Siuslaw Athletic Booster Club wants to make Siuslaw middle and high school students and their families aware that the Ian Foster Scholarship is available to students in need of assistance to pay for sports participation fees.

Last school year, 84 Ian Foster Scholarships were provided.

Winter sports registration is now open. Participation fees for high school sports are \$100 and the Ian Foster Scholarship pays for \$75 of that fee.

Participation fees for middle school sports are \$75 and the Ian Foster Scholarship pays for \$40 of that fee.

"There is nothing we do as a Booster Club that is more important than funding and providing the Ian Foster Scholarship," said Gina Castro-Brandt, SABC president. "We want every Siuslaw student at the middle and high school to participate in sports if they want to."

"The participation fee should not prevent students from being part of Siuslaw athletics. Everyone has difficult seasons in life and being part of a

team can be such a positive, especially during difficult times.

"We want to help make it happen."

The Ian Foster Fund was established shortly after the death of Ian Foster in the summer of 2005. With the help and support of the Foster family, a plan was developed by the athletic department to set aside donated monies to be used for students who might have difficulty paying the total cost of athletic participation fees.

An application process was developed requiring students to indicate their financial need. If a student is able to demonstrate significant financial

need, they receive the scholarship.

The athletic director is responsible for reviewing the applications and dispensing the money to students who meet the funding requirements.

## VIKS FALL TO CHEESEMAKERS

Siuslaw's hopes of continuing on into the post season toward the 4A state volleyball championship were cut short during a hard-fought match against Tillamook on Saturday.

Facing off at home on Glenn Butler Court, the Vikings lost in three sets,

each of which could've gone to either team during the match.

"We went down fighting," said first-year coach Jon Hornung, whose team claimed a share of the Far West League title and earned the leagues No. 1 seed into the state playoffs against Douglas. "We fought hard all season and exceeded a lot of expectations."

Against Tillamook, Siuslaw had a

difficult time against a team with multiple sources of offense in its arsenal, and the ability to hit Siuslaw's gaps and between its blocking — something no team has done effectively against the Viks this season.

"We haven't come up against a team with this many weapons and speed."

**MID COAST LAKES:**  
Rainbow trout stocking is complete along the mid coast. Holdover trout will be available in most lakes through the summer. Fishing for the various warm water fish species is good this time of year. There are numerous lakes in the Florence area that can provide good opportunity.

**SIUSLAW RIVER:**  
*Cutthroat, Chinook*

The Siuslaw River and bay is open for Chinook salmon. Fishing is fair. Trolling herring in the lower bay is an effective technique. Eggs and bobber can be productive in the upper bay and river as the season progresses.

For cutthroat trout, casting small spinners, spoons or fly fishing streamers or dry flies can be very effective.
