



These very same trees we value will threaten your life and/or home during our worst case disaster — the “Big One:” the Cascadia Subduction Zone Earthquake.

GPS data, collected since 2000, allows scientists to predict that the North American Plate, upon which we reside, will jump about 11 feet to the southwest

during the earthquake. Trees in the area will likely fall.

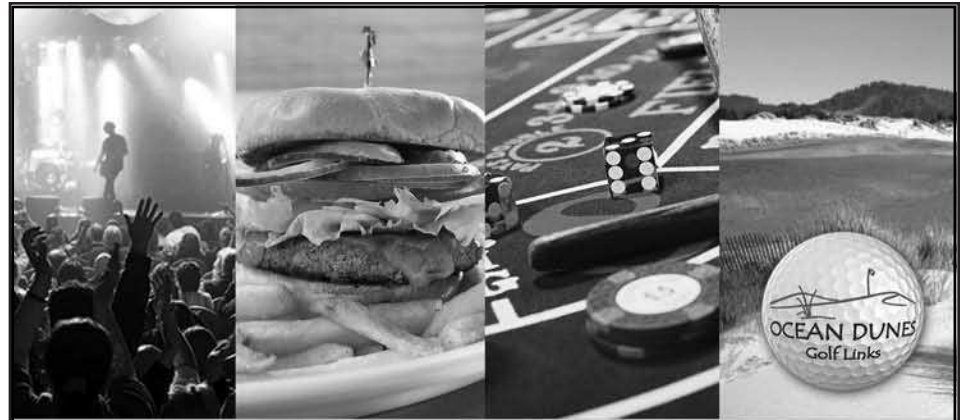
Oregon Office of Emergency Management strongly advises all residents living west of the Cascade Mountains to have an emergency cache of supplies that will last their household a minimum of two weeks.

Everyone must have their own Grab-N-Go Bags — one for home, one for car, one for work or school — with everything you need to survive during and after an emergency evacuation.

Coast residents can not expect emergency aid to arrive sooner than two weeks after the disaster. Stockpiling your own emergency supplies is 100 percent your own responsibility.
