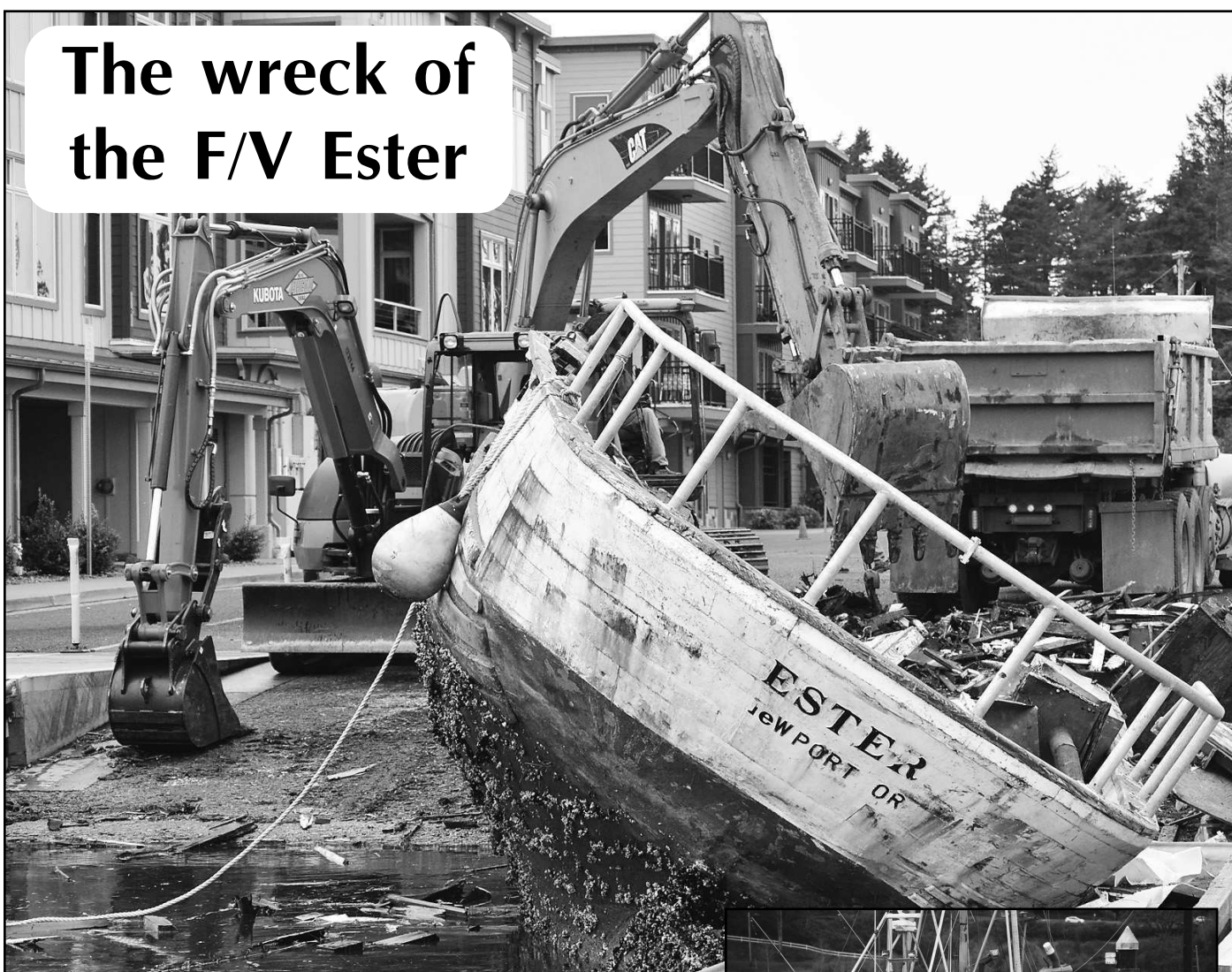

The 82-year-old fishing vessel Ester met an ignominious end Friday afternoon when a Northwest Hazmat demolition crew from Eugene beached the 43-foot vessel at the Port of Siuslaw boat ramp and dismantled the craft at a cost of \$8,000. Her owners abandoned the disabled vessel after the U.S. Coast Guard towed it into the port in March 2015. Precautions were taken to make sure no fuel or oil leaked out during the process. Port Manager Steven Leskin said, "We spent a lot of time trying to figure out if we could repurpose the boat, if we could sell it responsibly so that it wouldn't be back in the marina. We ultimately came to the conclusion that the only responsible decision for us was to destroy it."



PeaceHealth Peace Harbor recognizes National Hospice, Palliative Care Month

November is National Hospice and Palliative Care month. While PeaceHealth Peace Harbor Medical Center recently launched a new Palliative Care program, its nonprofit hospice program has been serving hundreds of families within the 25-mile Florence region including Westlake, Mapleton, Deadwood and Swisshome.

Hospice care is not a service often highlighted, but it is an important one. It empowers people facing a life-limiting illness — surrounded and supported by family and loved ones.

In Florence, Peace Harbor's hospice program is an example of a community coming together to help diverse populations access quality end-of-life care.

One example is Peace Harbor's "Flowers of Love" program.

Businesses like Florence in Bloom and Fred Meyer, and individuals like the Spencer

family, donate flowers that are assembled and distributed to patient rooms — lifting spirits of both patients and families.

Volunteers also come from as far as Mapleton and Yachats to help those in need. They make healing blankets and donate their time assisting with office support and patient comfort care.

Some work directly with patients, providing respite care for caregivers and families.

"Our hospice program really is an example of 'it takes a village,'" says Kathy Murphy, manager of Home Care Services at Peace Harbor. "We have an incredible team in Hospice Care, but the generosity of local community businesses as well as volunteers is really what allows us to deliver exceptional care to our patients."

"They really add to our patient's quality of life. We're grateful to be part of such a caring community."

Peace Harbor's Hospice pro-

gram will host a fundraiser and remembrance ceremony — Light Up A Life — on Saturday, Dec. 10, at 2 p.m. at Florence Events Center, 715 Quince St.

Money raised at this event goes to support a variety of hospice programs throughout the year.

The event allows anyone to purchase a star in remembrance of someone who has passed away or to honor someone who has made a difference in their life. All are welcome, whether or not your loved one was on hospice. Refreshments and music will be provided.
