Program offers property tax assistance

Lane County is participating in a new State initiative designed to help homeowners who fall behind in their property taxes.

The Oregon Homeownership Stabilization Initiative (OHSI) was created to administer United States Treasury Hardest Hit Funds, which provide foreclosure prevention and community housing stabilization through direct assistance to homeowners.

"Creating healthy and vibrant communities is a priority of Lane County," said Lane County Assessor Mike Cowles. "This initiative will help provide a safety net for people

who are at risk of losing their homes and also ensure County services don't lose funding as a result.

"Providing stability for families and the community is an important way to support a healthy community," he said.

Beginning Nov. 16, the program will provide up to \$40,000 to bring current delinquent property tax accounts for homeowners who meet the eligibility requirements.

The benefit is provided in the form of a no-interest, five-year forgivable loan for which a lien will be recorded against the property.

Homeowners may be eligi-

- ble to apply for assistance, if:
- They can afford their property taxes going forward, once they get caught up
 - Their current income does not exceed 120 percent of the state median income
 - They do not own other residential property
 - Their home is a one-unit, single-family, owner-occupied, primary residence, including condos, townhomes and de-titled manufactured homes
 - Their property value does not exceed \$625,000
