SIUSLAW NORTH JETTY SITE OF 'FREE FIRST DAY HIKE' JAN. 1

For the sixth consecutive year, Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) is partnering with state parks around the nation to offer free guided First Day Hikes in state parks throughout Oregon on New Year's Day.

Among the parks participating locally will be Jessie M. Honeyman Memorial State

Park just south of Florence. Hike time begins at 10 a.m. at the Siuslaw North Jetty, at the last parking lot near the Coast Guard tower.

It will be a moderate, two-mile hike on the beach with some hiking in sections of loose sand.

Come hike, celebrate and appreciate the 50-year anniversary of the Oregon Beach Bill,

which allows millions of people to experience the beauty of the Oregon Coast annually.

Ranger Paul Reilly will discuss the local flora and fauna of the area, geology and the historical perspective on the Oregon Beach Bill and how it affects us today.

Participants should dress in

layers, wear sturdy shoes and bring water as well as a camera or binoculars for wildlife viewing.

In case of inclement weather, the park should be contacted directly to find out about cancellation.

This year, OPRD is asking participants to share photos of their First Day Hike via social

media by using the hashtag #ORfirstdayhikes on Twitter and Instagram, or tagging "Oregon State Parks" on Facebook.

Whale Watching Week begins Dec. 27

Gray whales are on the move along the Oregon coast headed south to their winter grounds off Baja California, Mexico.

Let trained volunteers help you spot the migrating whales during the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department annual winter Whale Watching Week, Dec. 27-31. Volunteers with the "Whale Watching Spoken Here" program will be stationed at 24 sites, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., each of those days to share whale watching tips, migration facts and whale

feeding habits.

"We've already seen the first migrating gray whales in the past few days and we expect another excellent winter whale watching week," said Luke Parsons, Whale Watching Center ranger. "Last winter our volunteers helped people see more than 1,600 gray whales plus a pod of orcas and some humpback whales spotted on the central coast."

"You never know what you're going to see while you're whale watching, but that's half the fun."

The winter migration typically lasts until mid-January.

A map of the watch sites is available online at www.whale-spoken.org. Camping, including yurts and cabins, is available at state parks along the coast.

freshman Sam Myers tying things at 14-14 on a hard-fought rebound.

But the Huskies pulled away with a pair of freethrows and a 3-pointer to claim what would become the biggest lead of the game, 20-15.

In the final minute of the half, Siuslaw battled back with

shooting from posts Reavis and Myers, who were able to tie the game at 26-26 entering the break.

A full two minutes passed in the third quarter before the scoreboard changed, in favor of the Huskies, who sank a shirt jumper to move ahead 28-26.

An offensive board from Hickson tied the game again, with senior Kyle King putting

Siuslaw ahead by 2 points after driving into the paint.

With 4 minutes on the clock, the game was tied at 32-32 when Hickson went down with a knee injury that brought him out of the game.

Holding a slim 35-34 lead to start the fourth quarter, Reavis extended Siuslaw lead with a pair of freethrows, 37-34, only to have the Huskies reclaim the lead at 43-42 with 1:00 remaining.

A freethrow by Reavis, along with a 3-point play from King, gave Siuslaw a 47-43 lead with 30 seconds left.

Sweet Home struck back, draining a long 3-pointer to pull within 1 point, 46-47, as the clock cleared :09.

A freethrow from Reavis made it a 2-point game as the Vikings held out for a 49-46 win from the freethrow line.

Reavis led scoring with 19 points, King had 11, Hickson had 10, Myers and Ricky Jones had 4 points each, and Siuslaw got two points each from Jakob O'Connor and Brogan Cornish.

Last night, the Vikings hosted Sutherlin (after press deadlines) and will return to the hardwood Dec. 30 at Corbett High School.

League competition begins Jan. 13, when Siuslaw hosts South Umpqua, beginning at 7:30 p.m.

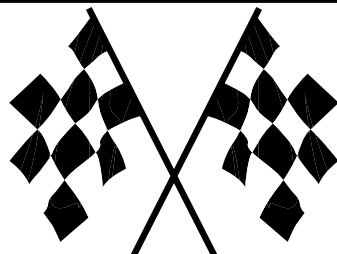
