She was an avid reader growing up and continued reading throughout her life. She loved animals and had many pets. In her youth she had a parrot "Pat" that was given to her by a sailor in Waldport.

She excelled in school, graduating from Waldport High School at the age of 16 as class Valedictorian.

After high school, she attended Oregon State College (Oregon State University), where she met and married Raymond Albert Funke. They moved to the Funke family farm in Florence and raised their four children: Jenny Masengil, Laurie Willis, Julie Dewsnup and Andrew Funke.

In 1968, they moved to Pleasant Hill, Ore., where they lived until retiring. While living in Pleasant Hill, Laura had several careers including Real Estate broker, insurance agent, and her favorite as a volunteer Fireman/EMT for the Pleasant Hill Fire Department.

Laura is survived by her husband and four children, as well as eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
