Sugars:

For good health choose natural sugars from fresh fruits and vegetables and drink fresh water. Eat organic products to avoid added chemicals.

Health experts advise that too much sugar and salt causes preventable high blood pressure with heart and blood vessel diseases, pre-diabetes, strokes, high cholesterol and pre-kidney failure, pre-diabetes and damages pancreas and liver.

All added sugars and artificial sweeteners promote obesi-

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention recommends limiting sugar to 100 calories a day. Six-and-onehalf teaspoons of sugar or two rounded tablespoons every 24 hours is 100 calories.

One teaspoon of sugar equals a 1/2 ounce; or 15 grams equals 15 calories.

A regular soda has 13 teaspoons of sugar or half a cup and 200 calories.

Salt:

Salt is for fluid balance in the human body. Some adults with normal blood pressure eat too little salt.

Check with your doctor

A small teaspoon of salt equals six grams. Less than one gram is a tiny pinch of

Babies are limited to less than one gram every 24 hours.

Check all baby food, commercial and homemade, for salt content before feeding your baby.

Three teaspoons equals one tablespoon (one ounce equals 14.3 grams.)

Too much salt damages the kidneys and causes kidney failure.

Adults with high blood pressure should have no more than 1,500 mg of salt per day.

Adults with congestive heart failure, liver cirrhosis or kidney disease need lower amounts.
