LCC board seeks applicants for Zone 1 seat

The Lane Community College Board of Education is seeking applicants for appointment to fill the remainder of the Zone 1 term which expires June 30, 2017.

Zone 1 represents western Lane County including Florence, Veneta and west Eugene.

Applicants should submit a letter of interest by April 1 and be prepared to interview with the board on April 12.

Board chairwoman Sharon Stiles of Florence stepped down from the post at the board's March 8 meeting; she is moving out of district.

Stiles thanked board members for their collegiality and commitment during her eight years on the board. Stiles chaired the board twice and also chaired the 2016/17 Presidential Search Committee.

The board approved Rosie Pryor to take over as chair and approved Matt Keating to serve

as vice chair.

The Zone 1, 3 and 4 seats on the seven-member board are up for election in the May 16 special election. Zone 3 represents the Springfield and Marcola area and is currently held by Dr. Gary LeClair of Springfield.

Zone 4 represents Eugene and the eastern part of the district and is currently held by Matt Keating.

Candidates interested in running for elected office must file with Lane County by March

16; information is online at www.lanecol.org/elections.

Board members serve four-year, non-paid terms.

The board has primary authority for establishing policies governing the operation of the college and adopting the college's annual budget.

Their charge is to oversee the development of programs and services which they believe will best serve the needs of the people of the Lane district.

Harlen Springer to speak at art documentary screening

Join Florence Regional Arts Alliance (FRAA) and City Lights Cinemas as they present the new documentary "Revolution — New Art for a New World" with special guest speaker Harlen Springer, who will speak about his experiences in Russia, the importance of art in community and how

public art can bring the landscape of Florence to new and inspiring heights.

The event will be held twice on Tuesday, March 14, at 12:30 and 6:30 p.m.

Revolution — New Art for a New World is a bold and exciting feature documentary that encapsulates a momentous period in the history of Russia and the Russian Avant Garde.

Drawing on the collections of major Russian institutions, contributions from contemporary artists, curators, performers and personal testimony from the descendants of those

involved, the film brings the artists of the Russian Avant-Garde to life.

It tells the stories of artists like Chagall, Kandinsky, Malevich and others — pioneers who flourished in response to the Utopian challenge of building a New Art for a New World, only to be broken by implacable authority after 15 short years.

After the show, join FRAA's Harlen Springer as he takes the audience through his recent journey to Russia, showing public art from the country and speaking about the influence of

art on the culture. Harlen will also present exhibits and a plethora of public art projects from around the world that will both fascinate and inspire.

Finally, Harlen will offer a look at the future of art with proposals of spectacular public art right here in Florence.
