RAIN speaker series features competition, differentiation

The Regional Accelerator and Innovation Network (RAIN) recently selected seven Florence startups for its inaugural coastal pre-accelerator, and the public is invited to participate right alongside them at a corresponding speaker series every other Wednesday.

The second event in the series features Thomas Blase, CEO of Blueprint, makers of design-focused bicycle accessories, such as the LightLock.

Blase will discuss market competition and product differentiation on Wednesday, March 29, from 5 to 6 p.m. at Oregon

Pacific Bank, 1355 Highway 101).

“Entrepreneurs shouldn’t necessarily be discouraged by a crowded marketplace. If anything, it should signal opportunity because no single company is offering a product that meets the needs of every consumer. You can be a very competitive business just by adding value to a product that already exists,” said RAIN Coastal Venture Catalyst David Youngentob.

The Eugene startup Blueprint developed LightLock as a real-life solution for bicyclists looking for a better way to protect their bikes and bike accessories. The lock detaches into two pieces. One half mounts on the handlebars and the other under the seat to become head-

lights and taillights. When riders reach their destination they can reattach the two halves around the bike, securing their lights, lock and bicycle. For more information, visit www.bluprintbike.com.

Every other week during the 12-week pre-accelerator program, RAIN will host a veteran entrepreneur to discuss a particular startup topic. These presentations are for small business owners, entrepreneurs, managers, students and anyone interested in learning more about how to launch and grow a business in Florence.
