Rotary Club seeks '4-Way' speech contestants

The Rotary Club of Florence is looking for contestants for its annual 4-Way Test high school speech contest.

Contest winners will share \$1,000 in cash prizes.

Any high school student in the Florence or Mapleton area, public, private or home-schooled, grades 9-12, are eligible to debate the ethical standards and behavior in today's world.

The Rotary Club of Florence invites students to share a subject they care about by partici-

pating in the 4-Way Test Speech Contest, which will be held Thursday, April 13, at 4 p.m. at the Florence Event Center.

Three finalists will then present their speeches and receive certificates and cash prizes totaling \$1,000 at a Rotary meeting at noon on Tuesday, April 18.

The winning speaker will also be invited to compete in the district level contest in Albany, Ore., on the weekend of May 20.

First prize in the contest is \$500, second prize is \$350, and third prize is \$150.

All participants will be required to take the Rotary 4-Way Test and apply it to real life throughout their speeches.

The 4-Way Test has four principles:

1. Is it the truth?
2. Is it fair to all concerned?
3. Will it build good will and better friendship?
4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

The choices for topics are

endless.

Would the Super Bowl pass the 4-Way Test? What about homework assignments? How about social networking?

All speeches must be original and may not be less than five minutes or more than seven minutes.

WLCF Scholarship Application deadline announced

Western Lane Community Foundation announces April 14, 2017, as the deadline for submission of scholarship applications for seniors at Mapleton and Siuslaw High Schools.

WLCF administers 15 scholarship funds, most of which are awarded annually and range from \$500 to \$2,500 each.

The funds represent yearly earnings from funds WLCF manages on behalf of generous donors from our local community.

Applications can be obtained

at the high school counseling offices or on line at www.wlcf.org and must be post-marked or received no later than April 14, at PO Box 1589, Florence, Ore., 97439, or submitted to the web address above by the same date.

Scholarships are available for traditional four year colleges as well as community colleges and accredited trade schools.

While academic achievement is one criteria used in determining recipients, the scholarship committee also carefully reviews outside activities, scholastic improvement, volunteerism, economic need, and work history.

Several of the scholarships are directed toward students in particular fields of education or with other qualifying characteristics such as mechanical interest, nursing, etc.

A word to the wise: Don't decide that you will never qualify for a scholarship. Apply and then let the awarding organization make that determination.

Many scholarship winners are surprised how many students receive scholarships who say they never thought that they might qualify.

Students with the best grades are not the only ones who earn scholarships. Many organizations prefer to award scholarships to those who might not get the highest grades or SATs but show promise of future success and the ability and desire to return to this community and share their talents and skills locally.

Last year, Western Lane

Community Foundation awarded over \$25,000 in scholarships and since its founding has awarded well over \$275,000 to both Mapleton and Siuslaw graduating seniors.

Home schooled students are not eligible for these scholarships but certainly are for the continuing education scholarships available during the summer.
