City seeks applicants for new advisory committee

The City of Florence has recently established a short-term ad-hoc committee called the Housing and Economic Opportunities Committee.

This group will be a working committee charged with completing the Buildable Lands Inventory and Housing and Economic Opportunities Analysis.

The committee shall serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council and staff in matters pertaining to affordable and workforce housing as well as economic development and job

creation.

The committee will review work products and provide recommendations on key project issues and decisions, providing guidance on scenarios and policy options and guiding stakeholder and community engagement strategies.

“Committee members will be invaluable to ensuring the communities voice is heard as the city makes some high level policy decisions on these topics that effect everyone,” says City Manager Erin Reynolds.

The City is looking for com-

munity members who represent a broad spectrum of community housing and economic development interests.

The committee will meet at approximately four meetings over the course of six months and will also be responsible for research and community outreach in between meetings.

Applying for a position is easy.

Applications are available at Florence City Hall and can be downloaded from the City’s website at www.ci.florence.or.us.

City Hall is open Monday thru Friday; 8 a.m. to noon and 1 to 5 p.m.

All qualified persons are encouraged to apply.

The process will include a public survey and short workshops.

Dunes City Planning Commission hearing April 27

Notice has been given that a hearing will be held by the Dunes City Planning Commission on Friday, April 27, beginning at 5 p.m.

The hearing will be held at Dunes City Hall, 82877 Spruce St.

The Dunes City Planning Commission will hold the hearing to provide a recommendation for the City Council to consider a public hearing May 11 to discuss the request for a Conditional Use Permit by the City for impacts related to an

existing building at 82877 Spruce St. that is encroaching on property located at 82878 Fir St. in Westlake.

The properties are Lane County Assessor’s Map 19-12-34-21 Tax Lots 05800 and 06300, respectively.

Failure to raise an issue to afford the decisionmaker and the applicant an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes the appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on that issue.

The evidence relied upon by

the applicant and the applicable criteria are available for inspection at no cost, and a copy can be provided at reasonable cost, upon request.

The staff report will be available for inspection at no cost at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing.

Written testimony and evidence must be directed toward the criteria described above or other criteria in the Comprehensive Plan or Land Use Regulation which is believed to apply to that deci-

sion, and may be submitted to the Dunes City Hall Planning Secretary, P.O. Box 97, Westlake, Ore., 97493, by calling 541-997-3338, or email planning@dunescityor.com, no later than the day of the public hearings.
