Pre-register for kindergarten Monday

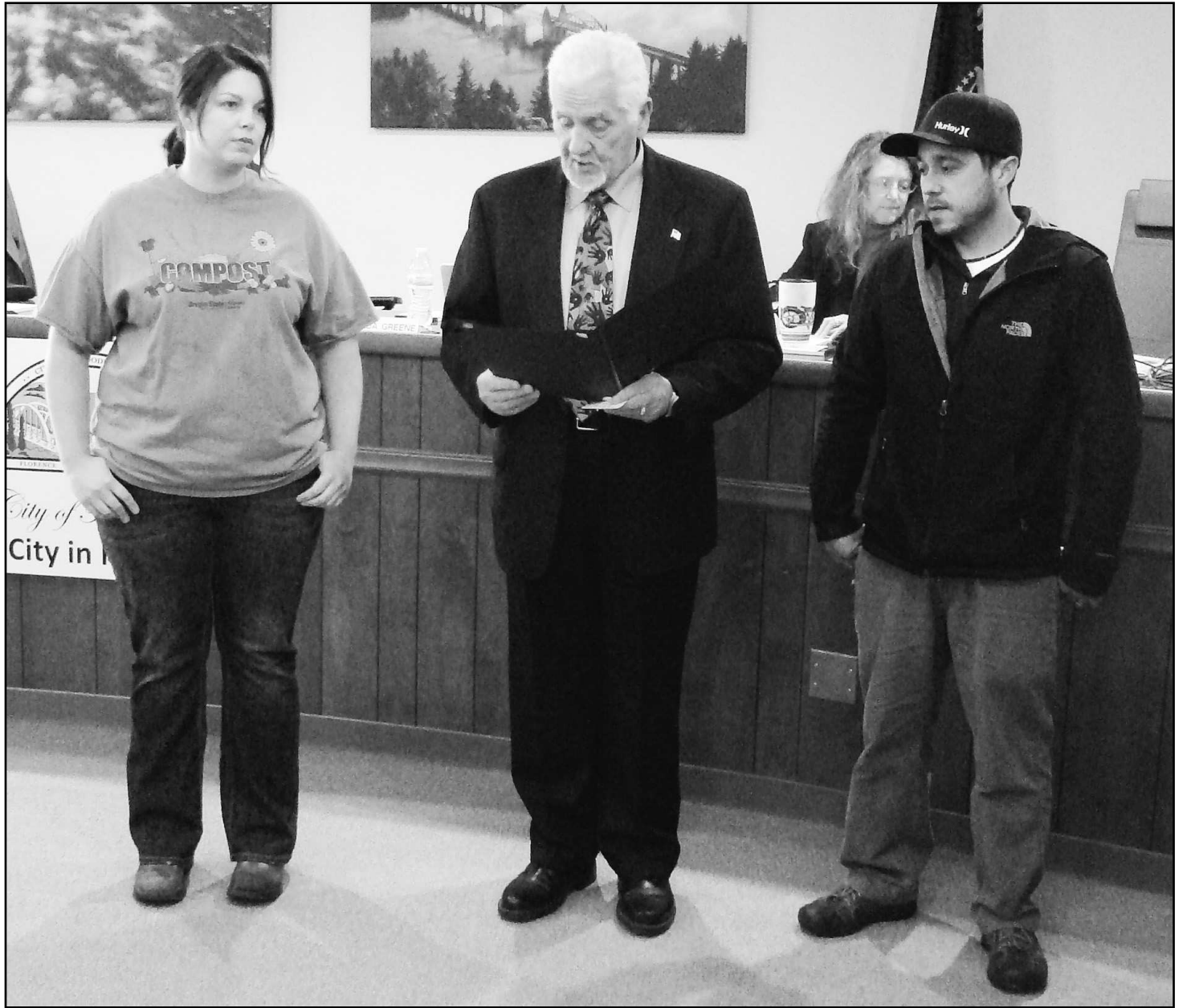
Siuslaw Elementary School is preparing for its Spring Kindergarten pre-registration and Meet and Greet. On Monday, April 24, from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m., parents and 2017-18 kindergarten students are invited to visit the classrooms and meet the teachers. Parents will also be able to learn more about the school readiness program, Kids in Transition to School (KITS). Kindergarten pre-registration packets have gone out to preschools in the area. Parents of children not in preschool can pick up packets at the elementary school at 2221 Oak St.

Full registration for kindergarten and all students will take place Aug. 15 to 17, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Siuslaw Elementary School. Oregon law requires that students starting school be up-to-date on all age-appropriate immunizations.
