Thompson among Beavers named Academic All-District

CORVALLIS — Siuslaw High School graduate and Oregon State University starting pitcher Jake Thompson was among three Beavers named to the CoSIDA (Collegiate Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-District 8 team.

Oregon State is the only Division-I team across the eight districts to have three

players selected.

All three are now eligible to become Academic All-Americans, a list scheduled to be announced June 2.

To be eligible to be honored academically by CoSIDA, student-athletes must be a starter or a significant reserve, have a cumulative grade point average of 3.3 or above and not be a freshman or first-year transfer.

Voting is done by members of CoSIDA from each district. District 8 is comprised of the states of Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon, Utah and Washington.

Thompson was also a Pac-12 All-Academic Honorable Mention in 2016.

An economics major, he holds a 3.60 cumulative GPA. Thompson, a Florence native,

is tied for the lead nationally with nine wins and is fourth with a 1.07 earned run average.

Teams are batting just .159 against him in 76 innings.

The Beavers hold the highest cumulative team GPA among men's teams at Oregon State.

The team's GPA entering the spring term stood at 3.30. The club finished with a 3.17 GPA in the winter.

unique birds of coastal Oregon, and hourly bird walks in both English and Spanish.

Saturday and Sunday, May 27 and 28: Celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Oregon Beach Bill, which provides public access to beaches along the length of the Oregon coast, by joining rangers and partners for a coastal BioBlitz.

Spend the day learning about and exploring tidepools.

On Sunday, help scientists catalogue what species can be found at Neptune State Park using the iNaturalist mobile app.

No special knowledge required.

Saturday, June 3: Celebrate

National Trails Day by joining rangers, the Yachats Trails Committee and Oregon State Parks for guided hikes on the Discovery Loop, West Side, and Amanda trails to learn about the ecology and history of the area.

These events are free, but a Northwest Forest Pass, Oregon Coast Passport, federal recreation pass, or \$5 day-use fee is required within the Cape Perpetua Scenic Area.
