Waterfront Depot awarded revitalization grant

Florence's Waterfront Depot has been awarded a \$21,000 matching grant for historic preservation and structural repairs through the Oregon Main Street Revitalization grant program.

The grants are awarded to projects that can make an economic impact by stimulating private investment and local economic development, and fit within a community's long range plan for downtown vitality.

"The Florence Area Chamber of Commerce is working to perpetuate the area's historic and aesthetic values. That's why we are partnering with the community in valuable ways that are visible and tangible," says Bettina Hannigan, the Chamber's executive director.

"One of those ways is with the Downtown Revitalization Team, a Chamber committee in support of the City of Florence's ReVision Florence program," she adds. "This was the catalyst for our success in winning the grant from the Main Street program," she said.

According to Oregon Main Street's website, the organization works with communities to develop comprehensive, incremental revitalization strategies based on a community's unique assets, character, and heritage. Their goal is "to

build high quality, livable, and sustainable communities that will grow Oregon's economy while maintaining a sense of place."

"I am so pleased to have been awarded the grant and excited to get to the next step,

which would be to schedule the appropriate contractors and get the work done as soon as possible," says Marianne Brisbane, the owner of the restaurant. "It really was not so difficult to get the ball rolling on this. It was just a matter of getting the estimates done in a timely matter and approaching it from a standpoint that targeted the core values of the program."

Brisbane specifically credits committee member Ellen Huntingdon, marketing coordinator at Oregon Pacific Bank, for help in successfully walking her through the grant request process.

Brisbane also mentioned she hopes other business and property owners in Florence will take advantage of the Oregon Main Street Revitalization grant program. Brisbane's grant was awarded for the full amount requested.

The team can be deployed during situations at the medical center hospital and other facilities that may require the decontamination to remove contamination by hazardous materials including chemicals, radioactive substances and infectious materials.

The caregivers' training was completed in compliance with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as a next step following the recent installation of a decontamination shower system in the

medical center's emergency department.

"This is yet another example of PeaceHealth Harbor's dedication to protecting and serving our community," said Rick Yeeny, Peace Harbor's chief administrative officer. "We recognized this as a gap in emergency preparedness care within our community."
