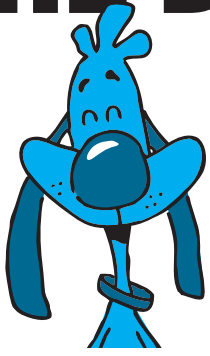

Step right up! Work with a friend or family member to calculate the **fewest** numbers of balloons to pop to reach 100.

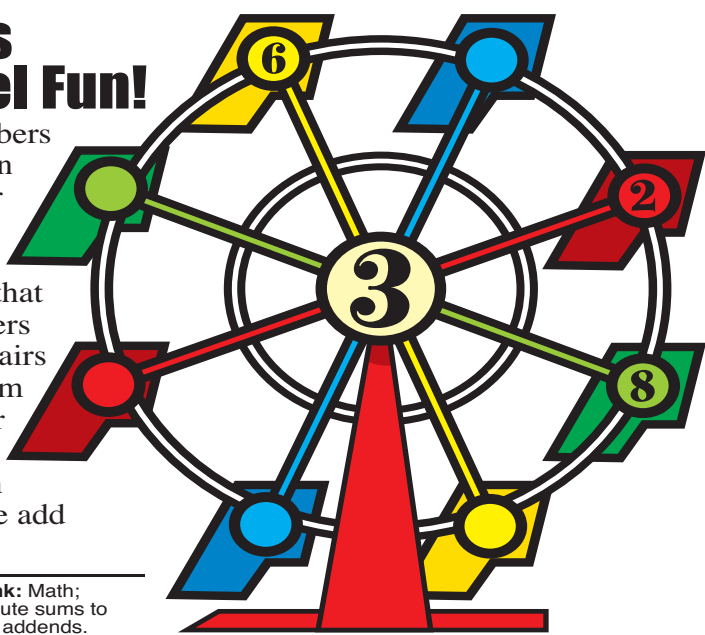
