## Free documentary to feature Music Festival

The Siletz Bay Music Festival Documentary, directed by Florence City Council member Joshua Greene, will be screened at City Lights Cinemas, along with a Q&A with the director, on Tuesday, June 6, at 6 p.m., during a free public screening.

The new documentary provides an in-depth look at the Oregon music festival and how the power of music can uplift a community.

Following the documentary, Greene will discuss his experiences in making the film, his plans on bringing parts of the festival to Florence with the Siuslaw Jam, and answer audience questions.

Greene first got involved with the Siletz Bay Music Festival when he was asked to film a couple of performances. He realized that just filming the routines of the festival didn't really get to the heart of why it was important. So Greene embarked on making a full documentary about the festival.

The festival itself started as a small concert to showcase jazz music, but has grown to a full

fledged music event the brings in thousands of people from all over the country.

But it wasn't the crowds that drew Greene to the project.

"The effect on the community has been extraordinary,"

Greene said. "While the festival now brings in some of the world's best musicians from jazz, classical music and musical theater, it also has changed how music is viewed in the Siletz Bay area."

The festival organizers were able to bring about the Studio to Schools program, an initiative that funds music programs in schools. The program makes learning music mandatory in the 6th grade, and with grants and donations, pays for musical instructor and instruments for the students. The program has since educated more than 1,000 children regarding the importance of the musical and theatrical arts.

The screening will be held in conjunction with the Siuslaw Jam music celebration, July 7 and 8, at the Florence Events Center. The Siuslaw Jam was started by Greene, who extended an invitation to the festival organizers, who became excited about the opportunity to perform at the FEC venue.

Tickets for The Siletz Bay Music Festival Documentary are free, and seats are available on a first come, first serve basis.

## Established 'Stroke' procedures can save lives

After Western Lane Ambulance District paramedics arrive at the local Emergency Department (ED) with a patient suffering a potential stroke, they immediately report the patient's medical condition to the nursing staff and ED Physician.

Paramedics will often call in a "stroke alert" to the ED staff, while still out in the field with the patient, in order to alert the ED so they can prepare for the patient's arrival.

This will also allow medical staff in the X-ray department to

prepare the CT-Scanner to be ready to get a brain scan to determine if there is any hemorrhagic bleeding.

In the majority of these cases, the patient will be brought straight from the ambulance to the CT Scan.

Once the patient is settled in the ED room, the physician will begin a full examination and consider treatment options according to the results of the CT Scan, the patient's medical condition, exam findings and other associated patient related information.

Peace Harbor Hospital (PHH) Emergency Department Physician William Foster explains what he is concerned

about upon examining the patient.

"Is the patient exhibiting neurological deficits such as weakness on one side of the body, and slurred speech or difficulty talking?" he asked.

When examining the CT-Scan, doctor's will review it for any indications of bleeding in the brain.

"This will let us know if we can give a medication called TPA, which essentially breaks up a clot in an artery in the brain," Foster said.

If there are indications of bleeding in the brain, then TPA cannot be given because it will worsen the brain bleed because it is a general blood thinner.

There is also a narrow window of opportunity of time to give the TPA, and that three hours from time of onset, according to Foster.

Once all the exams and treatments are completed at Peace Harbor Hospital, then the neurologist at a Regional Medical Center will be consulted for possible transference of the patient. Riverbend hospital in Springfield offers a neurology department, and many PHH are subsequently sent there, either by ground or air ambulance.

This allows patients to receive additional critical medical care in a specialized clinical setting.
